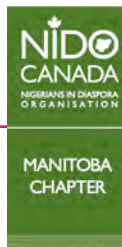

CALL FOR ABSTRACT



NIDO Canada World Conference 2009

May 16, 2009

Delta Hotel, Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada

The Nigerians in the Diaspora Organization (NIDO) Canada region will be hosting its 2nd annual world conference in Winnipeg, Canada May 15-16, 2009. The venue for the conference is Delta Hotel, located in downtown Winnipeg. The theme of this year's conference is "Health, Energy and Food Security: Key Factors for Achieving Vision 2020 Goals." Specifically, the conference will focus on the following topics:

- Energy security and climate change
- Food security in an interdependent world
- Health security through investment in research, healthcare delivery, and control of infectious diseases

There will be two Plenary Sessions and two concurrent Breakout Sessions

The organizing committee invites paper submissions on any of these topics from members of the worldwide community to be considered for presentation at the conference. Outstanding papers will be selected for oral presentation during either the plenary or the breakout sessions. At the time of submission, authors may specify their preferred session for presentation, although the organizing committee reserves the right to allocate a presentation to another session if required. Abstracts must be submitted and received by the program committee on or before February 28, 2009.

At the close of paper submissions, the program committee will review all abstracts and the submissions will be accepted or rejected. Each accepted abstract will be allocated to an appropriate oral session. Authors will be notified of the outcome of the review process by March 15, 2008. Please note that all presenting authors must register for the conference.

Format for Abstract Submission

Abstracts must be written in English and should not exceed 250 words. They must be submitted electronically through the conference page on NIDO Canada website. All submissions will be acknowledged by e-mail to the submitting and/or corresponding author.
